- One dose can not prevent the disease.

Prevention

- The MMR vaccine is best way to prevent Measles.
- No specific medical treatment.
- The virus should run its course(10 to 14 days)

Management and treatment

- Getting plenty of rest.
- Drinking lots of fluids.
- Gargling with salt water.
- Avoiding harsh light if your eyes hurt.
- Isolate self from school and public places

Suggestions

- Schools should continue enforce strictly the 2-dose measles-mumps-rubeola vaccination requirement before complete enrollment.
- States should consider revaccinating students who received measles vaccine outside of the United States.
